Dear Stakeholder,

Conservation and Water Stewardship is undertaking a management planning process for Nopiming and Manigotagan River Provincial Parks over the next two years. Management plans provide long term direction and address concerns associated with provincial parks. Current developments, concerns, management and patterns of use will inform and guide the preparation of the plans which will be developed in consultation with park users. The management plans will reaffirm that the Treaty and Aboriginal rights of Aboriginal peoples to pursue traditional uses and activities are acknowledged and respected.

You are invited to become involved in the consultation process by attending an informal drop-in session. The gathering of general information and identification of concerns are the first stage of this process. Sessions are scheduled for September and October as listed below.

Public consultation plays an important role in the management of Manitoba's provincial parks. At the drop-ins, park staff will be on hand to record your comments and discuss issues that should be considered in the development of the plan. Following these sessions, a report on public comments will be compiled and a draft management plan will be prepared and distributed online and by mail.
